AUTISM STATISTICS THAT DRIVE OUR WORK

PREVALENCE

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) affects all racial, ethnic and socio-economic groups and is the **fastest- growing developmental disability** in the United States.

Prevalence of autism in children has more than tripled over the last 18 years (.67% to 2.8%) According to an estimate by the Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Network, approximately **1 in 36** children have been diagnosed with ASD

THE SCHOOL AT AVONDALE HOUSE

Accredited by the Texas Alliance of Accredited Private Schools, the School at Avondale House provides a year-round, private education program for students aged 5-21. Our highly skilled team comprises certified teachers, licensed specialists, and expertly trained paraprofessionals, all working within an environment featuring state-of-the-art classrooms and boasting a low teacher-to-student ratio. This uniquely empowers Avondale House to deliver a highly personalized educational experience, aligned with each individual's education and behavior plan. Classes include weekly art and music lessons, community-based instructional outings, and daily recreation.

AVONDALE HOUSE SERVES ADULTS

Avondale House provides a long-term solution for adults with moderate to severe autism through an adult day program, group residential homes, and supported employment services.

ADULT DAY PROGRAM

Unfortunately, many individuals with autism face the challenge of losing critical support when they graduate from or age out of school-based autism services. Recognizing the pressing need to ensure that no adult with autism is left without essential support, Avondale House steps in to bridge this critical gap through its adult day program, providing an invaluable lifeline for individuals aged 22 and above. At our adult day program, we empower adults with autism by imparting vital life skills, enrichment opportunities, and pre-vocational training, all tailored to each participant's unique Individualized Service Plan (ISP).

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

We grew our program by **33%** and now have 43 participants enrolled

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

Licensed by the Texas Health and Human Services, Avondale House group residential services provide a supportive, long-term solution for adults with autism that are unable to reside independently or live with family due to the severity of their condition. Avondale House is home to 18 residents who enjoy family-style living and activities in three group homes. Individuals participate in weekend and evening recreation and receive 24/7 support from dedicated staff with their medical needs and daily hygiene as well as receiving training in everyday household tasks such as laundry, cooking and housekeeping.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES PROGRAM

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, **nearly 34%** of working age people with disabilities are in the labor force. Avondale House serves individuals on the autism spectrum and with intellectual and developmental disabilities who need assistance finding competitive employment. In partnership with the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), our programming provides job placement, supported employment and job skills training across multiple industries in the greater Houston area.

The **Avondale House employment services program** operates through a contractual partnership with the TWC to assist its clients in obtaining employment by providing the following services:

- Job Skills Training: Teaches the soft skills associated with competitive, integrated employment including, but not limited to: job searching, job applications, resume writing, interviewing, work-place communication and socialization
- **Job Placement:** Aids an individual in securing employment based on their expressed preferences
- Supported Employment Services: Offers continued support beyond initial employment by interfacing with HR
 departments and direct supervisors to help clients transition into their new roles and seek advancement where
 applicable

The employment services program additionally partners with corporate groups, such as Brunel, to provide program participants with valuable work experience and on-the-job training.

Brandon had a great work experience at Brunel, one of the program's partners, allowing him to practice the skills that he has learned in the Avondale House employment services program. We are thankful to Brunel for the opportunity and for the doors that the experience may open in the future!


